Rules for Reservation

As per notification no. 746-1-30th April 2013, 22% seats for SC, 6% for ST, 10% for OBC-A and 7% for OBC-B are reserved for Admission in Higher Educational Institution.

As per notification No. 07-Edn(U)/ 1U-89/13 dated 2nd January 2014, for admission to different courses, an SC or ST candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 25% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category. In case of OBC-A and OBC-B, candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 10% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of general category.

Caste/ tribe/ class identification certificate must be issued by the competent authority of the West Bengal Government as per GO no. 1203-BCW/MR-88/2014 dated 27/07/2015.

As per G.O No. 959-BCW/MR-52/2019 dated18.05.2023, benefit of Reservation under EWS category can be availed upon production of a EWS certificate issued by

- 1. Additional District Magistrate in charge of development matters of the District concerned
- 2. District Welfare Officer, Kolkata & Ex-Officio Joint Director, BCW &ID in respect of Kolkata covering the Jurisdiction of Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

EWS certificate is Valid for the financial year of issuance of certificate (benefit of Reservation under EWS category can be availed upon production of a EWS certificate issued in financial year 2023-24).

COLLEGE RULES FOR STUDENTS (CODE OF CONDUCT)

- 1. Each of our students should be sincere, disciplined and punctual.
- 2. She/he should not make noise in the library, the classrooms and the college office. Silence should be maintained while moving through the corridors and the Assembly Hall.
- 3. Each student is to participate in and keep discipline in various functions, meetings, competitions and such other activities of the college.
- 4. No student will be allowed to get in or out of a class without teacher's permission.
- 5. Regular and attentive class attendance is compulsory. Percentage of attendance will be taken into account in preparing results of the class tests or other examinations. Absence from the Honours class for three consecutive weeks without any intimation to the College Authority will lead to dropping the name of the students from the Attendance Register.
- 6. Students should observe all examination rules and abstain from adopting unfair means in the examination hall.
- 7. College Identity card should be collected from the college office and should kept secure as proof of studentship.
- 8. The Institution expects every student to have self-respect and to be proud of being a student of Polba Mahavidyalaya.
- 9. The Academic Calendar is to be regularly filled up. Application explaining reasons of absence is to be made as per proforma printed in the Academic calendar.
- 10. Use of mobile phone inside the classroom and college building is strictly prohibited.
- 11. After the commencement of classes every student will have to regularly follow all Notifications made by the College Authority, which will be displayed on the Notice Board. Information of general nature like, application for free studentship, date for filling up forms for University Examination, etc. will not be communicated individually.
- 12. Registration and Enrolment: Generally, within stipulated period of admission, each student is required to fill up Registration-cum-Enrolment form. This is a must for every student and as the University of Burdwan here gives a date line, and no student is generally allowed to fill up Registration-cum-Enrolment form beyond the date. If the Registration-cum-Enrolment form is not filled up in time, a student will not be eligible to appear at the University Examination subsequently.
- 13. Without permission beforehand, a student will not be allowed to enter into the protected areas of the Mahavidyalaya, viz., the Library, the College office, Principal's chamber and the Staff Room.
- 14. Students found guilty for damaging and misusing College property will be dealt with severely and shall be punished as per degree of offence.
- 15. Loitering of students outside the class room is strictly prohibited. Students should not create chaos; and quarrelling inside the Campus and by the side of College Office in particular is forbidden and attracts penal action.
- 16. Students can meet with the Principal on urgency from 03:00 p.m. to 03:30 p.m. on all working days, If the Principal is in office.
- 17. Attempt to create nuisance of any sort within the College premises is a penal offence and will be dealt with accordingly as per Rule of Law.
- 18. Students should take a note of the display on the College Notice Board every day and act as per instructions.
- 19. Outsiders will not be allowed to enter into the college premises without permission from the authority, failing which appropriate action will be taken against the trespassers.

Class Attendance

Regular attendance to classes is statutory and compulsory. Students must attend Classes as per Notification of The University of Burdwan. Attendance has bearing on the scoring of marks in the semester examinations. Students who fail to attend minimum number of classes actually taken shall be treated as non-collegiate. In some cases, these non-collegiate students may be allowed to appear at the University Final Examination. If a student after admission remains absent in classes for two consecutive weeks without any information, his/her name will automatically be struck off from the Attendance Register. As regards to Class attendance, it is mandatory for a student to obey the order(s) of the Department of Higher Education, Science & Technology and Bio Technology, Government of West Bengal and relevant instructions received from the University of Burdwan.

The number of books is increasing every time books are purchased as per lists given by our faculty members. Students are given cards to borrow books from the Mahavidyalaya Library. Books borrowed from the Library should be checked before borrowing and taken care of while reading. Loss or damage of books is to be compensated by the particular borrower. All students are entitled to borrow one book for fifteen days only. Any delay will be fined @ Rs. 0.50 paisa per book per day.

Currently, the library has approximately 11,000 books.

The Library of Polba Mahavidyalaya also houses leading newspapers, employment related publications, leading academic, scholarly and employment related magazines and various prestigious academic journals.

The Library also provides reprographic service for students on recommendation of the faculty members.

Enrolment- Cum- Registration

Students of 1stSemester will have to fill up the University Enrolment cum- Registration Form Online as and when notified by the College subject to the payment of requisite fees to the College. No chances will be provided after expiry of specific date and the College will not be liable for non-appearing at their respective University Examinations and non-Registration because of it.

College Examination

All Students are compulsorily required to appear at College Test Examinations and Class Tests held from time to time as per academic and curricular requirement and requirements of CCFUP. Attendance in Tutorial/Remedial classes is also compulsory. These are decisive factors in the matter of promotion or eligibility to sit for the University Examinations. Students failing to appear at College Internal Examination or Class Tests on medical ground must inform the Principal stating the reasons of absence along with a certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.

All such applications should be produced along with a letter from his/her Guardian & must be sent before the date of Examination or as soon as there is incidence of illness. This however, may not guarantee

promotion to higher semester or appearance in the UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION in the Semester System. Promotion to higher semester will be considered on the basis of performance and other parameters as would be fixed by the Academic Committee of the College.

Seminars & Other Academic Activities

Academic Departments regularly organise seminars and Lecture Sessions in the college to facilitate an academic culture among the students. Renowned Scholars and Experts in the respective areas are invited to deliver lecture from time to time. The Departments also organise other academic activities like Students' Seminars, Quiz contests, Debates and Excursions.

Add On Courses

The college believes in preparing its students for the future in all aspects. All courses are conducted internally or by faculty members hired by the college on contractual basis based on the basis of merit. A minimal fee is taken from the students for the computer course. These courses are a part of the official routine and all students are expected to attend these classes.

Computer Lab

The students have a separate Computer Laboratory dedicated to them for the Computer add-on course, requirements of CCFUP and other academic purposes.

Smart Class Room/ Virtual Class Room

The college encourages the use of most modern methods of imparting teaching and learning. For this, three fully ICT enabled smart class rooms have been formed. Lecture sessions, Multimedia teaching and educational film shows are being conducted in regular manner in these rooms. We have one Virtual Class Room.

Feedback Mechanism

The college has an existing mechanism for recording the feedback from students.

Career Counselling

The College is making its Career Counselling Cell more meaningful and effective. It will cater to the future employment related queries and needs of our students. The faculty members of the Mahavidyalaya are also eager to provide necessary advice in this regard to the students, whenever approached. The Mahavidyalaya is in touch with the industries in its vicinity and cordially welcomes them to conduct campus interviews.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college has been working incessantly according to National Assessment & Accreditation Cell and UGC Norms and has been striving for all-round Development of the college. IQAC develops quality parameters for amelioration of Academic Standard and meaningful application of Administrative Activities and regularly monitors proper implementations of plans and programmes in right perspective. The Cell always tries to create a learner centric atmosphere and Environment in the college to promote and ensure participatory teaching-learning process. At the end of each Academic Session feedback relating to Academic and Administrative functioning are taken from the students. Subsequently, opinion and views of the students are jotted down and appropriate measures are taken in right perspective.

We have One Canteen in the College. The Canteen is run with personal care and care for hygiene and health.

The campus is under optimum surveillance of CCTV cameras to ensure maximum security.

Common Room

Girls and Boys have been allotted separate Common Rooms with necessary amenities.




